As you arrive to the service there will be paper slips available for you to add the names of your loved ones. The completed names will be read throughout the service.

Attendance & Anonymous Income Survey

Firstly, during October the Church of England collects statistics on attendance – this figure forms part of the formula to determine parish share so you will see somebody counting numbers carefully at each service. Secondly, the anonymous income survey. The amount of money we are required to pay the Diocese and wider church is based on the size of the regular congregation and their income. To calculate an accurate figure we ask those who are: 16 & over; attend 12 times a year or more or regard St John's as their 'home' parish to complete an anonymous income survey. It is really important that all, particularly those who have little or no income to take part. It is your income (not family income) that counts. Nobody sees your response.
